

## **City of Hoyt Lakes Public Notice Election Day Voter Registration November 6, 2018**

To be eligible to vote in Minnesota you must:

- be at least 18-years-old on Election Day
- be a citizen of the United States
- have resided in Minnesota 20 days immediately preceding Election Day
- maintain residence at the address given on the registration form
- have any felony conviction record discharged, expired, or completed.
- not have had your voting rights revoked by a court; and
- not have been found legally incompetent by a court of law.

If you did not pre-register to vote, don't worry! You can still register or update your registration on Election Day. You must provide **one** of the following proofs of residence when registering to vote on Election Day:

### **Accepted Proofs of Residence**

- A Valid Minnesota driver's license, Minnesota ID card, or permit with current address (or a receipt for any of these).
- A tribal ID card with name, address, photo and signature
- A photo ID that does not have your current address **along with** a document that does have your current address.

#### **Eligible photo IDs:**

Driver's license, state ID card, or learner's permit issued by any state, U.S. passport, U.S. Military or Veteran ID card, Minnesota college/university/technical college/high school ID card, or tribal ID with name, photo and signature.

#### **Eligible documents with current address:**

Current student fee statement, bill/account/start of service statement due or dated within 30 days of Election Day, or a residential lease or rental agreement valid through Election Day. Eligible utility bills: gas, electric, solid waste, water, sewer, phone, cell phone, TV, internet, banking or credit card, rent or mortgage payments.

- Vouching: A registered voter in your precinct who will confirm your address with a signed oath at your polling place.
- College student ID with housing list. Colleges send election officials a student housing list. If you're on the list, show your college photo ID to complete your registration.
- A "Notice of Late Registration" you receive from your county auditor or city clerk.
- If you are currently registered in the precinct but changed names or moved within the same precinct, you only need tell election officials your previous name or address.
- Vouching: an employee of a residential facility where you reside (nursing home, Veteran's home, group home, battered women's shelter, homeless shelter, etc.) who will confirm your address with a signed oath at your polling place.
